	Full checklist	Abridged checklist
Mother and baby positioning	<ul> <li>Mother comfortable and relaxed</li> <li>Baby in close contact with mother</li> <li>Mother reports feeling no pain</li> <li>Head and neck of infant aligned facing breast</li> <li>Infant securely held</li> <li>Baby close to the breast, with the nose close to the nipple</li> <li>Baby's navel against mother's navel/abdomen</li> <li>Baby's neck slightly extended</li> <li>Chin touching breast (or very close to it)</li> <li>Nipple near upper lip (or under nose)</li> <li>The nipple appears round and symmetrical at the end of the feeding</li> <li>Mother-child eye contact, infant with eyes open</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Relaxed mother</li> <li>Close contact</li> <li>Painless</li> <li>Head and breast aligned</li> <li>Held infant</li> <li>Nose close to breast</li> <li>Navel to navel</li> <li>Slightly extended neck</li> <li>Chin against breast</li> <li>Nipple in upper lip</li> <li>Round, symmetrical nipple after feeding</li> <li>Eye contact</li> </ul>
Infant	<ul> <li>Mouth wide open</li> <li>Curled upper and lower lips</li> <li>Tongue cups nipple and areola</li> <li>Full, round cheeks (no dimples)</li> <li>There is more areola above the top lip than below</li> <li>A large part of the areola is in the baby's mouth</li> <li>Slow and deep sucking</li> <li>Swallowing can be seen and heard</li> <li>No clicking or smacking sounds</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Mouth wide open</li> <li>Curled lips</li> <li>Tongue cups nipple and areola</li> <li>No dimples</li> <li>More areola visible at top</li> <li>Most of the areola is in mouth</li> <li>Slow and deep sucking</li> <li>Swallowing seen and heard</li> <li>No clicking or smacking sounds</li> <li>Rapid jaw movements with pauses in between</li> </ul>

Signs of milk transfer	<ul> <li>Wetness around baby's mouth</li> <li>Infant's limbs relax progressively</li> <li>The breast gradually softens</li> <li>Milk leaking from the opposite nipple</li> <li>Mother feels signs of milk ejection (thirst, relaxation or drowsiness, uterine contractions)</li> <li>Infant releasees nipple spontaneously at end of feeding</li> <li>Infant appears satisfied after feeding</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Milk seen</li> <li>Progressive infant relaxation</li> <li>Breast softens</li> <li>Milk leaking from the opposite nipple</li> <li>Signs of letdown</li> <li>Spontaneous release of nipple</li> <li>Satisfied after feeding</li> </ul>
